You can be better. You can look better. Almost everybody I know wants to be better at some level, some place in their life. So we read through the ads or we listen to what they tell us on TV. We see the before and after shots.

What are those things we are somehow convinced are going to help us find our worth or our significance? Maybe it is to wear a certain kind of clothes or to live in a certain house or to drive a certain kind of car or eat the right kind of food or to take the right kind of vacations or use the right kind of paper towels.... then we will be happy. Our life will be full and content and peaceful. The reality is we don't end up being as happy as we thought.

I think happiness is over-rated because it is so subjective. It is subject to what is going on in our life. It is subject to what happens to us. It is subject to what people say about us. It is subject to how others react to us.

Somehow life is not working out for us. Situations have come. Difficulties have come. Disappointments have entered into our world. Now so many are just stuck being unhappy. Not at peace. There is a lot about people that says they are not very happy. They are not very content. There is no real anchor point in their life and so, when the storms kick up and blow in, they have no way to deal with it. They then go on that elusive search for happiness. They discover that too often the happenings in their life determines the happiness in their life. Each of us can have joy and peace regardless of the issues in our life.

But it is going to require radical reconstruction of our hearts. Jesus tells us, in the 5th Chapter of Mathew, that we must make some character changes. It is what God does best when we let him.

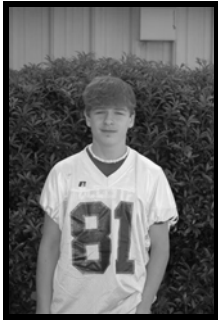

PARENTS AND SENIORS:

It's hard to believe that our summer vacation has ended and "your senior year" has begun. It's going to be a fast-paced and exciting year for all of you. There are a lot of decisions to be made concerning your future goals and ambitions. I will be available to provide guidance and assistance as you determine which direction is the one that you wish to pursue. Each year a large 3-ring binder is compiled noting any scholarships, college opportunities, deadlines, etc. that seniors need to know. This is information that is mailed to me from various colleges across the nation. The notebook is housed in the Guidance Office, and checked out by students during elective classes. Also, at least once a month I visit 12G and 12W during English to make them aware of any new information I have received. Seniors are always welcome to stop by with any concerns or questions.

Also, note that **each senior has a required scheduled individual appointment** in the guidance office. This appointment is mandatory in order to determine that each senior is on schedule to graduate, and is taking prompt action toward his or her chosen college or career. These appointments will begin next week. December 1 is the "rule of thumb" deadline for college applications. **However, it is up to you to contact your college to see what their requirements are.** The internet is the quickest way to access that information. Each college can differ and dates can change from year to year.

The next scheduled American College Testing Program (ACT) is **October 27, 2007**. Packets are available in the Guidance Office, or you may register online at www.act.org

All senior young men are required to register with **Selective Service** within **30 days of your eighteenth birthday**. The Selective Service is a government agency whose job is to provide untrained manpower for the Armed Forces if there is a national emergency. You can register online at www.sss.gov or go by the Post Office and complete a registration form.

**HOOPER ACADEMY
WORK ASSESSMENT PROGRAM**

This work assessment program was created to stimulate and increase participation and involvement by all families in maintenance and other activities at Hooper Academy and was approved by the West Montgomery Education Foundation Board members. Families, who do not desire to actively participate in maintenance, repair, and other projects which save the school operating expense or make money for the school, may elect to pay the optional assessment of \$360.00 per school year.

Program Guidelines

1. Work Verification Forms are available in the office and show details of work performed, the number of hours worked, a space for your signature verifying the work, and a space for the form to be signed by an authorizing member. Authorizing members are any member of the current board of trustees, headmaster, booster club officers, PTA officers, or fine arts officers. If you turn in a form without a signature from one of these authorizing members it will not be credited to your account. All Work Verification Forms must be turned in within the calendar month in which the work was performed. Verification forms turned in outside the calendar month in which the work was performed will not be credited to your account. For work assessment program purposes, the school year runs from June 1st to May 31st each year.
2. Assessments will be prorated according to hours worked.
Example
Works hours required from each family: $24 \times \$15.00 = \360.00
Work hours credited to your family: $16 \times \$15.00 = \240.00
Assessment due for the year = \$120.00
3. Statements for assessments will mailed before May 15th each year and are due before June 15th of the school year. All Work Verification Forms and assessments due must be completed or paid in full before final report cards are issued.
4. Work performed on school grounds, in or on school facilities, money-making projects, concessions, providing transportation for student groups, or other approved work, will count as work hour credits. Any person or family having difficulty reaching their required hours should contact the school office for work assignments well in advance of the end of the school year. Hours worked over 24 per year will not be forwarded to the next year. However, we do need and appreciate all time worked for the improvement of our school.
5. Each individual or family is responsible for completing, signing, acquiring an authorizing member's signature, and turning in the Work Verification Form to the office for processing. Due to billing concerns, Work Verification Forms must be signed by an authorizing member and turned in to the office within the calendar month the work was completed or the work hours will not be credited to your account. Work Verification Forms are the only authorized forms, not spreadsheets or other paperwork.
