## **From the Headmaster...**

### Teachers Working With Students

Good teaching depends upon effective interaction between students and teachers. Being a master teacher, means the commitment to the following:

1. We must accommodate different learning styles and aptitudes by varying teaching styles, evaluation devices, class formats, and active-learning projects. We should encourage students at all ability levels by reinforcing their strong points and holding high, but realistic, expectations, thus motivating students to fulfill their potential, to grow and to stretch themselves with a minimum risk of crashing failure. We should be able to use teaching mastery methods to enable students to learn from their mistakes.
2. Communicating regularly and consistently to all our students that we are on their side and desire their success.
3. Handling any confrontation with, or corrections of a student in a manner that respects that student's dignity.
4. Respecting each student's privacy when announcing grades or returning graded material.
5. Never belittle a student publicly or privately; never using humor at the expense of any student.
6. Establishing "Coaching" formats in which the student's strengths are reinforced and weaknesses are identified and corrected.
7. Including student activities such as labs, oral presentations, portfolio development, small group projects, guided discussions, board work and seat work to promote active learning with the focus on students rather than teacher performance. Taking an active coaching role during all such activities to provide strong, individualized feedback and reinforcement.
8. Returning all students work while the material is still current. Making a point to include positive criticism and suggestions for improvement on each piece of returned students work. Providing opportunities, where appropriate, for students to redo and submit written work based on the criticisms and suggestions.
9. Constantly including motivation in our planning and teaching with the realization that our attitudes and enthusiasm can set the tone for the student's work.
10. Challenging students to go beyond rote learning, literal comprehension, and the mastery of facts to encourage critical and analytical thinking.
11. Teaching and insisting on a consistent school wide format in assigning book reports, research papers, science projects, and the like.

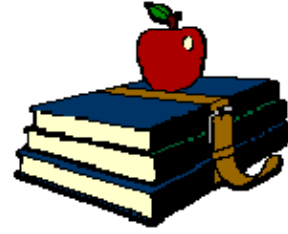
### K-5 News

# Hooper Academy Work Assessment Program

This work assessment program was created to stimulate and increase participation and involvement by all families in maintenance and other activities at Hooper Academy and was approved by the West Montgomery Education Foundation Board members. Families, who do not desire to actively participate in maintenance, repair, and other projects which save the school operating expense or make money for the school, may elect to pay the optional assessment of \$360.00 per school year.

## Program Guidelines

1. Work Verification Forms are available in the office and show details of work performed, the number of hours worked, a space for your signature verifying the work, and a space for the form to be signed by an authorizing member. Authorizing members are any member of the current board of trustees, headmaster, booster club officers, PTA officers, or fine arts officers. If you turn in a form without a signature from one of these authorizing members it will not be credited to your account. All Work Verification Forms must be turned in within the calendar month in which the work was performed. Verification forms turned in outside the calendar month in which the work was performed will not be credited to your account. For work assessment program purposes, the school year runs from June 1st to May 31st each year.
2. Assessments will be prorated according to hours worked.

## Example

Works hours required from each family:  $24 \times \$15.00 = \$360.00$

Work hours credited to your family:  $16 \times \$15.00 = \$240.00$

Assessment due for the year = \$120.00

3. Statements for assessments will mailed before May 15th each year and are due before June 15th of the school year. All Work Verification Forms and assessments due must be completed or paid in full before final report cards are issued.
4. Work performed on school grounds, in or on school facilities, moneymaking projects, concessions, providing transportation for student groups, or other approved work, will count as work hour credits. Any person or family having difficulty reaching their required hours should contact the school office for work assignments well in advance of the end of the school year. Hours worked over 24 per year will not be forwarded to the next year. However, we do need and appreciate all time worked for the improvement of our school.
5. Each individual or family is responsible for completing, signing, acquiring an authorizing member's signature, and turning in the Work Verification Form to the office for processing. Due to billing concerns, Work Verification Forms must be signed by an authorizing member and turned in to the office ***within the calendar month the work was completed*** or the work hours will not be credited to your account. Work Verification Forms are the only authorized forms, not spreadsheets or other paperwork.

## Counselors Corner

### **PARENTS OF SENIORS:**

It's hard to believe that our summer vacation has ended and "your senior year" has begun. It's going to be a fast-paced and exciting year for all of you. There are a lot of decisions to be made concerning your future goals and ambitions. I will be available to provide guidance and assistance as you determine which direction is the one that you wish to pursue. As many of you know by now, I have an open door policy for students and parents and I want to be available to you as you experience this important time in your life.

### **Senior Conferences:**

Please note that **each senior has a required scheduled individual appointment** in the guidance office. This appointment is mandatory in order to determine that each senior is on schedule to graduate, and is taking prompt action toward his or her chosen college or career. These appointments will begin next week. Also, I am available to parents as well who wish to meet with me and discuss the steps we need to take to ensure your students success and future after their senior year.

### **College Opportunities/Scholarships**

Each year a large 3-ring binder is compiled noting any scholarships, college opportunities, deadlines, etc. that seniors need to know. This is information that is mailed to me from various colleges across the nation. The notebook is housed in the Guidance Office, and checked out by students during elective classes. Also, I visit 12G and 12W during English to make them aware of any new information I have received.

### **Deadlines for College Applications:**

**December 1** is the "rule of thumb" deadline for college applications. I believe that it is never too early to be making application with their college of choice. Remember, early application = early acceptance. I am readily available to you and your student to help you through this step by step process. **However, it is very important to contact your student's college to see what their requirements are.** The internet is the quickest way to access that information. Each college can differ and dates can change from year to year.

### **Selective Service**

All senior young men are required to register with **Selective Service** within **30 days of your eighteenth birthday**. The Selective Service is a government agency whose job is to provide untrained manpower for the Armed Forces if there is a national emergency. You can register online at [www.sss.gov](http://www.sss.gov) or go by the Post Office and complete a registration form.

I highly encourage the students who register by mail or online to create FREE ACT web account so that they may have the most up to date scores the minute they are published online.
