Hooper Academy Students Tour Washington, DC



During the last week in April, Mr. John Mehaffey and several of his students from Hooper Academy's 8th grade class traveled by chartered bus to Washington DC. They enjoyed a guided tour of our nation's capitol city. The tour started with a visit to the Vietnam, Korean Conflict, and World War II Memorials as well as the Lincoln Memorial. Afterwards, the class went to the National Archives to view our Declaration of Independence, Constitution, and Bill of Rights. Hooper students then had lunch at our U. S. Capitol Building. After lunch, they had the opportunity to view a film and tour part of the building including the rotunda and Senate chamber. The group then went to 1600 Pennsylvania Avenue to see the White House. They ended the day with dinner at Pizzeria Uno in Union Station and a visit to the Jefferson Memorial before returning to the hotel.

The second day of the trip began with a tour of Arlington Cemetery. The class was able to view the changing of the guards at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. They also saw the graves of the Kennedy brothers with the eternal flame and took a tour of

Robert E Lee's home, which was located near the cemetery grounds. After a visit to the Iwo Jimo Memorial, the group enjoyed lunch at the National Mall and had several hours to visit the Smithsonian Institute Complex. The Museum of Natural History, Museum of American History, and the Air and Space Museum were favorites among the students. The tour then took the students to the Franklin D Roosevelt Memorial that included four outdoor rooms with waterfalls and beautiful gardens. That evening, the group attended a Washington Nationals verses New York Mets baseball game.

The third day of the trip began with a tour of the Washington National Cathedral. After viewing the incredible architecture, paintings, and stained glass, the group took a riding tour of Embassy row. The students had lunch at the Old Post Office where they were able to see a 360-degree view of Washington DC from the observation deck in the clock tower. Afterwards, they visited the Smithsonian American Art Museum, which included a Presidential gallery. A tour of Ford's Theatre was next which is where President Abraham Lincoln was assassinated on April 14, 1865. A final stop was made at the Pentagon Memorial, which was opened on September 11, 2008. It honors the 184 victims which were killed in the building and on American Airlines Flight 77 on September 11, 2001. Dinner was at the Pentagon Mall that evening and then the group returned to the hotel for some much needed rest!

The final day of the trip took us back to the National Mall and then the Washington Monument. The group had the opportunity to ride to the top of the 555 feet and 5 1/8 inch monument, which is the world's tallest stone structure, and see one final amazing view of Washington DC. Afterwards, the class visited the Holocaust Museum for an emotional tour which honors the millions of people that died during the Nazi regime under the rule of Adolf Hitler during World War II. The last stop was at Mount Vernon, the home of George and Martha Washington. The class had the opportunity to tour their home as well as the grounds including the outbuildings, gardens, and the tomb of George Washington and his family. After a rest on the lawn of the estate with a view of the Potomac River, the group boarded the bus for the 15-hour ride home. This was a historic, fun, and memorable trip taken by Hooper Academy students.

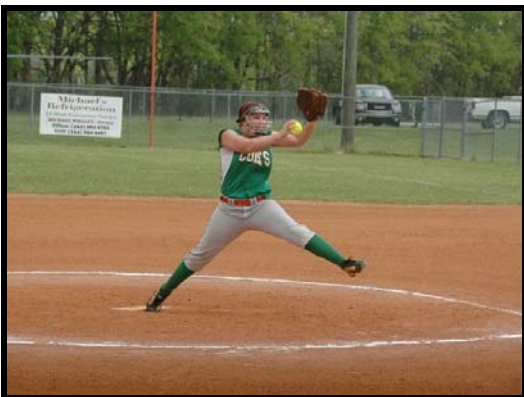
